Strengthening Children and Youth Advocacy work

BACKGROUND

- Young people are often marginalized and ignored in decision-making and development processes. The government is not doing much to invest in them
- Government is working with its partners including DCI-SL, UNICEF, Plan Int. and other NGO's to build Child Protection Systems in the country.
- This has been done in Western area, Moyamba, Bombali, Port Loko, Kailahun, Bo and kenema Districts.
- Koinadugu/Kabala is one of the districts that has not had such a network and therefore limits the opportunity for children and young people in Kabala to participate and contribute to development processes at communities, district and national levels.
- Further more, UNICEF (2013 : An Evaluation of Teenage Pregnancy Pilot Projects in Sierra Leone) report indicated that Koinadugu is one of the leading districts where issues of teenage pregnancies and early marriages are at alarming rate up to date. This has not only limited the role children and young persons play in the development of the district but has also reduced their role in effective decision making processes as it is with the VAC/CYAB implemented projects in the six listed above; with this current trend, the need for children to participate in decision making processes and capacity building to be self-reliant at communities, districts and national levels are of vital importance, hence this project is designed to fill in the gap.





- To strengthen and harmonize the work of existing children and youth groups for effective participation.
- To influence the District Council to include child protection into their development agenda
- To support advocacy work of children and youths in order to assist them contribute to addressing issues that affect them particularly at the local level.



40 CHILDREN TO FORM the GROUP

- Level 1: DCI-SL will train 40 children/youths (20 girls and 20 boys) as members of the CYAB and peer educators and advocates for children and youths in Kabala
- **Level 2:** The 40 CYAB peer educators will reach out to at least 120 children and youths in the community each year to bring positive influence into their lives through knowledge transfer. The strategy is that each CYAB member should target at least three children/youths every year from the community. These will be the children that they will bring together to commemorate the Day of the African Child- June 16th every year.

Age limit: children: 14-17years

Youth: 18-21 years

- The children can identify issues in school and mobilize themselves in addressing it with their school authorities

- partnering with other child groups in cleaning their environment every Saturday as a way of ensuring their right for a clean and safe environment
- Effective drama performances impacting knowledge on their rights and responsibilities to their peers in schools and communities
- CYAB is recognized as a child base organization and is always receive formal letters inviting them to represent children in every forum of decision making on development programmes within the district
- CYAB girls are invited by Child Protection Agencies for radio discussions on girls education and early marriage.
- Boys are strongly supporting and motivating girls in the group and also serve as role models for other boys in schools
- CYAB developed a study group that takes classes on science subjects every Saturday by a volunteer science teacher.

CHALLENGES

- Domestic engagement of children limit their participation at meetings
- Lack of guidance counselors in Schools
- Limited services in the District to linkup the children with
- Traditional and customary practices
- Schools not providing quality education
- Increase in Teenage Pregnancy
- Child labour
- Lack of case management (service providers lack the technicality to handle child abuse cases)
- Lack of Child Welfare committees
- Teachers are ignorant about the "Teachers Code of Conduct"
- Limitation on my mandates to actively respond to juvenile Justice issues but rather than my implementing program but to observe and do referral when such issues emerged
- A single staff implementing the whole project ;even though it is part of the project proposal and contract because it's a small project is challenging
- Lack internet service ad sometimes phone coverage

- CYAB inviting a Self-Reliant model to have a 15min talk every one week during morning assembles


- 1. Organise activities to observe every international children's day
