## Youth Advocacy Network, Kabala Sierra Leone

Stichting Taiama-Andreas The Netherlands

August 2018

In August 2017 a group of 20 young people between the age of 14 and 23 from Kabala and the villages around Kabala started the Youth Advocacy Network (YAN). Kabala, is the capital city of Koinadugu District, a large district in the north of Sierra Leone. Koinadugu district is one of the poorest and least developed districts in the country. Because of the almost impossible situation people live their lives to survive, it is not surprising that corruption is more become common than exception. And because more than half of the population in Sierra Leone is below the age of 18, these young people got the idea that they themselves have to take action to improve their situation and the situation of their peers to get a better, meaningful and safe life. YAN wanted to advocate for their peers on child marriage, teenage pregnancy and to promote education. Education is the key to success. To get finance they started a partnership with Stichting Taiama-Andreas (STA) in the Netherlands, a foundation they met in February 2017 when members of Stichting Taiama-Andreas visited a large NGO in Sierra Leone.

First YAN and STA looked at YAN-members who needed support for education: you cannot advocate for others if you yourself cannot afford your own education. 13 members were selected and the sub project SCHOOL FEES was born.

ADVOCACY ACTIVITIES started on October 11 the international day of the girl with a visit to Kondembaia village inside the mining district. The goal was to raise awareness on issues affecting girls.

After the first activity, Yan made a Constitution, created a logo and a motto and arranged the registration as a CBO.

In January two members of STA visited YAN to meet and listen to their challenges and needs. The most important conclusions were that YAN needed an office for themselves because till now they used the office of social welfare or had meetings in the open air and that it was good to start working on the sustainability of YAN. Therefore the idea of exploring a farm and start tailoring of pads for girls to sell were born.

YAN continued their advocacy activities especially during the elections in March. In May the opening of the office was a fact and in June the farming started on a field at the compound of Kabala Secondary School. In July STA found a donor for the sewing machine.

YAN is standing at the beginning of something great. The limit of 35 members has been reached and there is a lot of interest of stakeholders in YAN activities. In the first year a lot of investments were made in the sense of money but the most important was the women- and men power of the YAN members. Without their efforts and enthusiasm these huge progress has not been possible.
